Please note that the core sequence starts with 2000-level German courses. GERM 1004 is a prerequisite for all GERM courses 2000-level or above. Students placing into lower levels of German (GERM 1001-1004) after an associates degree may complete the major within four years, but they should contact their advisor as soon as possible for more information. This concentration requires a minor, but most students double major in another subject; it's fairly easy to do with the right planning.

All guides are meant as an example of how a degree can be completed. However, individual plans will be developed for each student in consultation with the academic advisor. Course availability, prior credit, course prerequisites, major requirements, and student needs must be considered in developing the individual academic pathway.
