Minimum S.H. Required for Degree 126

Students entering the public health studies degree program choose one of three concentrations: community health, prehealth professions, or worksite health promotion. The community health concentration requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.65 for entry. Students entering the worksite health promotion concentration must have a minimum cumulative 2.25 GPA and a minimum 2.5 GPA calculated on three courses: ECON 2113; HLTH 2000; PSYC 3241. Students entering the prehealth professions concentration must have a minimum cumulative 2.75 GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA calculated on the following courses: BIOL 1100, BIOL 1101, BIOL 1200, BIOL 1201; CHEM 1150, CHEM 1151, CHEM 1160, CHEM 1161.

Students must maintain a min. 2.0 GPA in the required cognates and all HLTH courses must be passed with a "C-" grade or better. A student earning a D in any of these courses must petition the Dept of Health Ed and Promotion for probationary continuation. No student on probation may enroll for HLTH 4991.

Electives are used to reach 126 hours. It is recommended that courses be taken which reinforce content in the physical, social, and behavioral sciences, or provide students with a community health speciality area such as gerontology, environmental health or health promotion.

¹Courses must be completed before student is eligible to declare major.

Students preparing for entry into graduate health professional schools or programs including Medicine, Dentistry, Physical Therapy, Pharmacy, and Optometry should check with specific schools to see if prerequisite coursework completed at a community college is eligible for admission.

All guides are meant as an example of how a degree can be completed. However, individual plans will be developed for each student in consultation with the academic advisor. Course availability, prior credit, course prerequisites, major requirements, and student needs must be considered in developing the individual academic pathway.
