<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>Students who have successfully completed HEA 110 since the Fall 2016 term will earn ECU credit for both HLTH 1000 (2 hours) and KINE 1000 (1 hour). Students who completed HEA 110 prior to the Fall 2016 term and who have not also taken PED 110 will be responsible for meeting the Health-Related Physical Activity Competency component of the ECU General Education Program to meet degree requirements.

<sup>3</sup>Students who do not complete ENG 241 at the community college will need to complete an ENGL or LING elective above 2999 through enrollment at ECU to meet the requirements of the English Academic Concentration NOTE: Credit will only be awarded for transferable courses for which a grade of C (2.0) or better is earned.

#### Minimum Credit Hours Required for Graduation:

120

The Bachelor of Science in Middle Grades Education requires a minimum of 120 semester hours. ECU requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA and a minimum 2.0 major GPA for graduation. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required for admission to the program. Students must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. A minimum grade of C (2.0) is required in each of the professional studies and specialty area courses for middle grades licensure.

Middle grades majors are required to complete two academic concentrations appropriate for licensure. A methods course is required for certification in each of the two academic concentrations leading to middle grades licensure. No substitutions for methods classes may be made without special middle grades program approval. Middle Grades education majors must have a minimum grade of C (2.0) in each of the concentration courses.
