Completing at least 12 s.h. of coursework (GPA 2.5 or higher) in a foreign language (Level I - IV) and demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language by scoring an average of Intermediate-Mid, as determined by the Department of Management Chair on the International Business Program Coordinator based on test scores on the AAPPL Test or 2. Students who demonstrate a language proficiency (based on test scores on the AAPPL) without taking 12 s.h. of foreign language, must complete 12 s.h. of international coursework during required study abroad as approved by the Department of Management Chair or the International Business Program Coordinator.

Minimum Credit Hours Required for Graduation:

120

The Bachelor of Business Administration requires a minimum of 120 semester hours. ECU requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA and a minimum 2.0 major GPA for graduation. Upon admission to the university, students may declare an intended major in accounting, finance, management, management information systems, or marketing. Students must meet the following requirements prior to taking 4000-level or concentration courses for the BSBA degree: **1.** Completion of a minimum of 45 s.h. **2.** Cumulative GPA of 2.5 on 4.0 scale. **3.** Completion of the declaration courses listed below or equivalent course work with a minimum grade of C- in each and a 2.5 average over the eight courses: ACCT 2401, ACCT 2521; ECON 2113, ECON 2133; FINA 2244; MATH 1065, MATH 2283; MIS 2223. **4.** Once enrolled at East Carolina University, a student will be limited to a maximum of two attempts per declaration course, including course withdrawals after the schedule adjustment period, regardless of the institution where attempted. Students who have not met the above requirements may take a maximum of 30 s.h. of 2000- and 3000-level business courses.

Seniors must successfully complete the Senior Business Exam (SBE) in their last semester or summer term before graduation from the BSBA program. The SBE is administered near the end of each semester and summer term. Failure to successfully complete the SBE will result in the student being delayed from graduating in the BSBA program as this competency exam is a program requirement.
