Alcohol & Drug Studies (24 s.h.)

Required: ADRE 2003, 4793, 4796 and PSYC 3221 (PSY 237) and 3375 (PSY 281).

Forensic Science (24-26 s.h.)

Required: JUST 1000 (CJC 111), 3007, 3020, 3022, and 3023

Choose 3-4 from: ANTH 3026, BIOL 2130 (BIO 163), CHEM 2650, and other approved courses.

Political Science (24 s.h.)

Required: POLS 1010 (POL 120), 2010 (POL 210), and 2020 (POL 220)
