**Additional Requirements**

Competency in one foreign language as demonstrated by scoring Intermediate-High on the Listening and Reading sections and Intermediate-Mid on the Speaking and Writing sections of the ACTFL Test. Minimum of one semester abroad, enrolled in an approved academic program with a focal world region.

MAT 263 will be accepted as a substitute for MATH 1066. Students are recommended to complete this at the community college before transferring to ECU.
