WHEREAS, Students desire to take courses (the Courses) at the Agencies and have those courses transfer to ECU and,

WHEREAS, Each agency agrees to allow students to take courses as indicated on Exhibit B, which Exhibit B as defined in Section 3 below; and,

WHEREAS, ECU will allow students to transfer the Courses to ECU.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and covenants made each to the other, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The term of this Agreement (Term) shall begin on the Effective Date and shall continue for a period of three (3) years. Any party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause, by providing 30 days written notice to the other party. Additionally, this Agreement may be terminated as outlined herein or because of breach. However, any students who have matriculated at ECU pursuant to this Agreement shall be continued through completion of the Degree Program.
- 2. Attached hereto, and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set out, is "Exhibit A", which outlines all academic requirements for admission into the University and specific requirements for admission into the program (reference current catalog).
- 3. Also attached hereto, and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set out, is "Exhibit B", which contains the transfer course table.
- 4. ECU and each agency shall each appoint a designated representative to coordinate the requirements of this agreement.
- 5. Each agency shall verify that instructors teaching courses listed in Exhibit B transfer course table meet the minimum faculty credentialing requirements for ECU's regional accrediting body the Southern Association of Schools Commission on Colleges.

- 6. Each party shall keep the other parties informed of changes in curriculum, program and staff that may affect the requirements of this agreement. If courses listed in "Exhibit B" change, the parties will review the changes and, if acceptable, a new "Exhibit B" reflecting those changes may be substituted. The parties shall indicate on the new "Exhibit B" the effective date of the changes. If the changes are not acceptable to either party, then this Agreement may be renegotiated or terminated.
- 7. Agencies shall not discriminate on the basis of race/ethnicity, color, gender identity, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, age, veteran status, political affiliation, genetic information, or disability.
- 8. The ECU Bilateral Agreement Committee (Committee) shall review the Program biennially to determine its effectiveness. The Committee's review will be in accordance with the standards set out in Section 3 of ECU Regulation No. 02.07.04, Approval and Review of Bilateral Agreements.
- 9. Each agency shall be considered an independent contractor and as such shall be wholly responsible for its work in accordance with this Agreement. Nothing herein is intended or shall be construed to establish any agency, partnership, or joint venture between the agency and ECU.
- 10. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the liability of ECU, as an agency of the State of North Carolina, for any injury or damage arising out of ECU's, its employees' or agents' performance under this Agreement is subject to the limitations of the North Carolina Tort Claims Act, N.C.G.S.§143-291, et. seq. (the "Act"). ECU does not waive any rights or defenses under the Act or the rights and authority of the Attorney General of the State of North Carolina to represent ECU.
- 11. All Agencies shall indemnify and hold ECU, its trustees, officers, employees and agents harmless for any and all claims, loss, liability, demands, or damages, including attorney's fees and court costs, due to the negligent acts of any Agency's employees or agents in any Agency's performance of this Agreement. This Section 11 shall not apply if the Agency is an agency of the State of North Carolina covered under the Act.
- 12. ECU has determined that each agency is a school official with a legitimate educational interest under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). If ECU provides any Agency with "personally identifiable information" from a student's education record as defined by FERPA, 34 CFR §99.3, each Agency hereby certifies that collection of this information from ECU is necessary for Agency's duties and responsibilities under this Agreement. Each Agency further certifies that it shall maintain the confidential status of the education records in their custody, and that it shall maintain the personally identifiable information as directed by FERPA. Failure to abide by FERPA may result in the interruption, suspension and/or termination of the relationship with Agency for a period of at least five (5) years from the date of the violation. If any Agency experiences a breach relating to this information or if the Agency re-discloses this information, the Agency shall immediately notify ECU. To the extent allowed by law, the Agency shall indemnify ECU for any breach of confidentiality or failure of its responsibilities to protect confidential information. Specifically, these costs may include, but are not limited to, the cost of notification of affected persons as a result of its unauthorized release of ECU data provided to Agency pursuant to this Agreement.
- 13. Notices: Any notices or other communications between the parties shall be in writing and shall be given effectively if: posted by certified United States Mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested or

delivered by an overnight delivery service that keeps proof of delivery. Any notice or communications shall be addressed as follows or at such other address as may be from time to time designated in writing in accordance with this Section 13:

- 15. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and there are no representations, inducement, or other provisions other than those expressed herein. All changes, additions or deletions to this Agreement shall be in writing and executed by authorized representative(s) of each party.
- 16. The Auditor of the State of North Carolina and/or ECU's internal auditor shall have access to persons and records as a result of all agreements entered into by ECU in accordance with N.C.G.S. §147-64.7. **IN WITNESS THEREOF**, the parties have executed this Agreement in duplicate originals, one of which is retained by each of the parties, effective as of the date of the last signature below.

Academic requirements for admission into ECU and specific requirements for admission into the program.

At ECU, admission to the Graduate School includes an application, official transcripts, a copy of your teaching license, and two letters of recommendation from someone aware of your potential as a graduate student. Applicants must have an overall undergraduate GPA of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale. There is no testing requirement unless you are simultaneously seeking a master's degree. Other MOU partners will adhere to their specific institutional admissions requirements.

Memorandum of Agreement

For the Elementary Mathematics Education cohort beginning Fall 2020— ECU, UNCC, UNCG, and UNCW agree to the following collaborative offering of the six courses in the EMAoL Program-of-Study.

- 1. Each participating university agrees to offer up to three of the six courses in an online format blending synchronous and asynchronous instruction.
- 2. Enrollment will be done in UNC Online through the student's home institution for all courses. Notwithstanding the enrollment method, when a student completes the course, the credit from the host institution conducting the course will be counted as transfer credit and not as credit from the home institution. The student will be billed for the courses by his/her home institution for all courses, who will retain the funds.
- 3. The parties will create an attribute that will allow non-degree seeking students from the MOU schools to enroll in the courses without having to fill out application paperwork for each school. Each institution will rely upon the student's home institution to have asked all required safety questions, performed any needed backgrounds checks, and cleared the students who enroll.
- 4. Courses will be offered with a minimum of eight students. Course enrollment will be capped at 21 students unless an instructor agrees to other arrangements. Enrollment will be balanced among the four institutions as needed.
- 5. If by the start of the first course in the program-of-study, one of the institutions has over fifteen students registered, depending on the size of enrollment at the other institutions, the first institution may choose to offer the cohort separately from the other sites. Such a change will be discussed with the other sites to ensure that the other sites can continue to provide all six of the courses in the program-of-study.
- 6. If by the start of the first course in the program-of-study, one of the institutions has less than a third of the required number of graduate students necessary to support the institutions offering of a graduate-level course, it is understood that the size of the cohort may make it impossible for that institution to honor this MOA.
- 7. Faculty will meet annually to discuss the curriculum and assessment of each course to ensure consistency. Discussions should include but are not limited to any suggested revisions to the courses, any needed amendments to this MOA, program assessment issues, and faculty changes.
- 8. For ease of scheduling, it is agreed that all synchronous online classes will be offered bi-weekly from 5:00-7:50pm. The following schedule will apply:

Fall Year 1 (Number and Operations) - ECU will provide instruction for MATE 6058 (ELED 6311 at UNCC; TED 658 at UNCG; EDN 580 at UNCW)

Spring Year 1 (Rational Numbers and Operations) – UNCW will provide instruction for EDN 582 (MATE 6059 at ECU; ELED 6314 at UNCC; TED 659 at UNCG)


Summer Year 1 (Data Analysis and Measurement) - UNCW will provide instruction for EDN 585 (MATE 6060 at ECU; ELED 6315 at UNCC; TED 660 at UNCG)

Fall Year 2 (Algebraic Reasoning) - ECU will provide instruction for MATE 6061. (ELED 6313 at UNCC; TED 661 at UNCG; EDN 587 at UNCW)

Spring Year 2 (Geometry) – UNCG will provide instruction for TED 662 (MATE 6062 at ECU, ELED 6312 at UNCC; EDN 578 at UNCW)

Summer Year 2 (Mathematical Modeling) – UNCC will provide instruction for ELED 6316 (MATE 6063 at ECU; TED 663 at UNCG; EDN 571 at UNCW)

This agreement may be amended as necessary. For example, the order of offerings may be altered if all parties agree.
