Minimum Credit Hours Required for Graduation:

The Bachelor of Science in Health Information Management requires a minimum of 120 semester hours. ECU requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA and a minimum 2.0 major GPA for graduation. A minimum 2.5 GPA is required for admission to the professional phase (junior and senior levels) of the Health Information Management curriculum. See health information management admission packet for specific admission information. Majors must earn a minimum grade of C (2.0) in all foundations, cognate and core courses before progressing on to subsequent courses in the HIMA curriculum. A student earning a grade below C (2.0) in any of these courses must petition the Department of Health Services and Information Management for probationary continuation and may be required to repeat the course. Three grades below C (2.0) will result in dismissal from the HIMA program.

Admission to the Health Information Management program is competitive. A completed application does not guarantee admission to the program.
