#### **Minimum Credit Hours Required for Graduation:**

The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art requires a minimum of 120 semester hours. ECU requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA and a minimum 2.0 major GPA for graduation. Concentrations are offered in Animation and Interactive Design, Ceramics, Film and Video Production, Graphic Design, Illustration, Metal Design, Painting, Photography, Printmaking, Sculpture, and Textile Design. **An** approved senior show is required to meet graduation requirements.

Admission to this program is by portfolio review. Entrance is competitive and space may be limited. Students not accepted into their preferred area of concentration should be prepared to seek alternative areas of concentration and/or degree programs. Students should speak with faculty in their desired concentration to receive detailed instructions regarding the portfolio review process and requirements.
