Six semester hours (6 s.h.) of junior level courses (3000 level or above) are required. The student may choose 18 s.h. from an existing minor or certificate, or design a specialized area of focus. Faculty and program director work closely with the student to ensure an appropriate fit between selected courses and entrepreneurial interest, before acceptance into the entrepreneurship degree program.

Minimum Credit Hours Required for Graduation:

The Bachelor of Science in Entrepreneurship requires a minimum of 120 semester hours. ECU requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA and a minimum 2.0 major GPA for graduation. Admission requirements for the Entrepreneurship major include the following: **1.** Completion of a minimum of 45 s.h. **2.** Completion of the following courses with a C or better: ACCT 2101, ECON 2113, ECON 2133, FINA 2244, FINA 3500, ENTR 3500, MATH 1065 or 1066, MATH 2228 or MATH 2283; **3.** 2.0 GPA or better; and **4.** A competitive application process that includes a statement of specialty area and entrepreneurial goals.
