<sup>1</sup>Students enrolling at ECU must fulfill the writing across the curriculum requirement prior to graduation. To do so, each student must complete a minimum of four writing intensive (WI) courses, including ENGL 1100 and ENGL 2201; at least one WI course in the major; and any other WI course of the student's choice.

<sup>2</sup>Students who have successfully completed HEA 110 since the Fall 2016 term will earn ECU credit for both HLTH 1000 (2 hours) and KINE 1000 (1 hour). Students who completed HEA 110 prior to the Fall 2016 term and who have not also taken PED 110 will be responsible for meeting the Health-Related Physical Activity Competency component of the ECU General Education Program to meet degree requirements.

<sup>3</sup>Transferability of ECU courses at the NCCC level is up to each institution. Contact your NC Community College for further information.

<sup>4</sup>Concentrations require portfolio review for acceptance. Students apply to concentrations after successfully completing the following courses: ART 2070 (Animation and interactive design); ART 2105 or 2115 (Ceramics); ART 2205 (Film and Video Production); ART 2200 and ART 2210 (Graphic Design); ART 2230 (Illustration); ART 2300 (Metal design); ART 1020 or 103; 2560 and 2561, or 3561 (Painting); ART 2225 (Photography); ART 2010 and 2600 or 3600 (Printmaking); ART 3705 (Sculpture); or ART 2303 and 2325, 2326, 2335, or 2336 (Textile Design). Out of these concentrations, the following courses should reverse transfer as potential elective credit: ART 1030, 2560, 2300, 2303, 2205, 2705, 2105.

#### NOTE: Credit will only be awarded for transferable courses for which a grade of C (2.0) or better is earned.

Upon application and admission to ECU, students will submit an application to their concentration. The prospective student should contact an AREA COORDINATOR in a discipline of their interest for the specific application requirements. More information can be found on the School of Art website.

#### **Minimum Credit Hours Required for Graduation:**

120

The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art requires a minimum of 120 semester hours. ECU requires a minimum 2.0 overall GPA and a minimum 2.0 major GPA for graduation. Concentrations are offered in Animation and Interactive Design, Ceramics, Film and Video Production, Graphic Design, Illustration, Metal Design, Painting, Photography, Printmaking, Sculpture, and Textile Design. **An approved senior show is required to meet graduation requirements.** 

Admission to this program is by portfolio review. **Entrance is competitive and space may be limited.** Students not accepted into their preferred area of concentration should be prepared to seek alternative areas of concentration and/or degree programs. Students should speak with faculty in their desired concentration to receive detailed instructions regarding the portfolio review process and requirements.

<sup>5</sup>NOTE: Completion of a 3 s.h. Global Diversity (GD) course and a 3 s.h. Domestic Diversity (DD) course are requirements of all ECU degrees. Though not required for transfer, recommended or required courses marked with GD or DD above should satisfy the requirement; students may choose other courses in these recommended areas. These courses can coincide with other General Education or Major courses.
