

BSN PLANNING WORKSHEET FOR PROSPECTIVE NCCCS TRANSFER STUDENTS

ABOUT THIS DOCUMENT

This worksheet was designed to help prospective NCCCS transfer students interested in applying directly to the BSN program at East Carolina University learn eligibility requirements and determine where they stand in completing the general education and prerequisite coursework required to apply to the program. **This is not the official application worksheet needed for submission of application;** it is a planning device for North Carolina Community College Transfer Students.

REQUIRED GENERAL EDUCATION AND PREREQUISITE COURSES

Required courses can be taken at ECU, a community college, or another regionally accredited college or university. For credits to officially transfer to ECU, a final grade of C or higher is required in the course. The following transfer resources can be used to look up established course equivalences for ECU:

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be an eligible BSN applicant, you must meet ALL the following criteria:

- **Minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.75**
 - *The College will include all grades, in all courses from all schools attended when calculating GPA for admission; some exceptions may apply*
- **A final grade of C or higher in these specific prerequisite courses:**
 - *MATH 1065, CHEM 1120, CHEM 1130, BIOL 2140 & 2141, BIOL 2150 & 2151, and BIOL 2110 & 2111*
 - *Pass/fail grades are not acceptable for these specific course requirements*
 - *ECU requires a grade of C or higher to transfer credit officially for all coursework completed at other institutions*
- **Completed all, or be enrolled in, final set of general education and prerequisite courses listed above at the time of application submission**
 - *If any courses are outstanding at the time of application submission, your application will not be considered, and you will receive an ineligible notification from the Office of Student Services; ineligible applications may count toward max attempts for admission*
 - *It is the applicant's responsibility to confirm they have completed, or are enrolled in, the correct equivalent courses to meet program requirements before submitting their application*
- **Completed at least one attempt on the [HESI A2 pre-nursing entrance exam](#)**
- **Submit a complete online application with all required documents by the application deadline noted below**
 - *Incomplete applications will not be considered and may count against your max attempts for admission*
 - *Instructions for accessing the online BSN application are provided below*

IMPORTANT NOTES

- Your application to the traditional BSN program at ECU will be considered a maximum of two times. Other nursing pathways may still be options.
- Applicants admitted to the BSN program who are not current students, must be admitted to East Carolina University. (See [Admissions](#) for more info)
- Admitted students must successfully complete any required general education and prerequisite courses in progress at the time of application or their seat in the program will be rescinded.
- Admitted students must successfully pass a criminal background check and drug test or their seat in the program will be rescinded.
- Applicants who have been previously admitted to the clinical portion of an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program at a community college or Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program at another university must have left that program in good standing to be eligible to apply to the BSN program at ECU. These students are required to submit a letter from the Dean or Director of their former program with their application. This does not include students who were pre-nursing or working on program prerequisites for nursing at another institution.
- Admission is highly competitive and based on cumulative admission GPA, points earned in current ranking formula, and scores on HESI A2 exam.

ACCESSING THE ONLINE BSN APPLICATION

Current students receive the application link from their advisor. Students not currently enrolled at ECU who wish to apply directly to the BSN program should email CONAdvising@ecu.edu to request a link to the online BSN application. **To confirm eligibility to apply please include 1) a completed copy of the application worksheet and 2) unofficial transcript(s) from all schools attended for verification. A link will not be provided if these items are missing.**
