Students entering the Community and Regional Planning, BS program are encouraged to declare their major as soon as possible in accordance with university requirements.

Time to degree completion will depend on student enrollment status and offering of required courses. It is highly recommended that transfer students contact the their community college to discuss specific course suggestions.
