The core curriculum in economics is intended to give students an understanding of markets and market outcomes. Students will learn how individuals, businesses, governments, and nations make choices about how to allocate scarce resources.

Economics majors are required to earn a minimum grade of C (2.0) in each of the following courses: ECON 2113, ECON 2133, ECON 3144, ECON 3244.

As a transfer student, it is important to contact an ECU Academic Advisor, thcasadvising@ecu.edu, as soon as possible.

An example of how to plan your first 2 years of the traditional 4 years of study is included at the end of this document. Please be advised that depending on when you transfer, and how many equivalent courses you take at the community college, it may take more than 4 years to complete your degree.
