Skilled jobs in the 21st century will go to people who can communicate in a variety of situations, with people from all walks of life, and through media and technology. The English, BA prepares students for such careers. English majors create their own paths through the major, selecting courses in literature, creative writing, multicultural and transnational literature, business and technical communication, linguistics, rhetoric and composition, folklore, and film studies. Students develop a number of skills valuable in the workplace, in volunteer organizations, and in civic and family life. Above all, English majors are skilled analysts and effective writers.
