- Transfer students must have completed at least 12 hours at East Carolina University and have a cumulative GPA of 2.7 to declare Family and Consumer Services Education as a major.
- As a transfer student, it is important to contact an ECU Academic Advisor, hpadvising@ecu.edu, as soon as possible.

An example of how to plan your first 2 years of the traditional 4 years of study is included at the end of this document. However, depending on when you transfer and how many recommended courses you take at the community college, it may take longer than 4 years to complete any degree at ECU.

Other states have their own requirements, and you'll want to make sure your program meets criteria in your home state (or state where you intend to work) before you apply.
