To meet ECU degree requirements, a globally diverse general education course should ideally be taken while completing your AA/AS. Please choose one course from the following: ANT 210, ANT 220, ANT 240/240A; ART 111; DRA 111; ENG 261; GEO 111, GEO 113; HIS 111, HIS 112; MUS 110; POL 210; REL 110, REL 211, REL 212. These courses would apply to different areas of an AA or AS. Consult with your advisor if you have questions.

- You do not have to complete all NCCCS equivalents or recommended courses before transferring. However, taking minimal recommendations may prolong your time to degree at ECU. Other courses to complete an AA or AS are student's choice; no other current department recommendations.
- Completion of an AA or AS, including MAT 171 and HEA 110, qualifies students for a General Education waiver, as long as all other General Education Program requirements are met.
