East Carolina University, **BS RECREATIONAL THERAPY**

The Recreational Therapy, BS program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) through the Committee on Accreditation for Recreational Therapy Education (CARTE).

Any student wishing to declare a major in recreational therapy (RT) must, at the time of entrance into the curriculum, possess

- a minimum 2.5 GPA;
- have completed ENGL 1100, ENGL 2201; MATH 1065 or MATH 1066 or MATH 2127 or MATH 2228;
 BIOL 2130, BIOL 2131 and RCTX 2230;
- have submitted a recorded interview and application;
- have a personal interview with a RT faculty member; and
- have completed a sequencing form (timetable) in consultation with a RCTX advisor in the HHP Advising Center.

Due to the competitive nature of this program, and the requirements to apply, students should dualenroll with ECU in their final semester in order to complete RCTX 2230.

Transfer students should email an Academic Advisor as soon as possible, hhpadvising@ecu.edu.

An example of how to plan your first 2 years of the traditional 4 years of study is included at the end of this document. However, depending on when you transfer and how many recommended courses you take at the community college, it may take longer than 4 years to complete any degree at ECU.

The curriculum for all ECU Certificates, Degrees, and Minors have been designed to meet the licensure/certification requirements in North Carolina and prepare students to sit for licensure/certification exams in North Carolina. The various licensure boards in each state are responsible for setting requirements for licensure/certification in their state. Other states have their own requirements, and you'll want to make sure your program meets criteria in your home state (or state where you intend to work) before you apply. Search our state Licensure Dashboard to see if the program you're interested in meets the educational requirements for licensing/certification in your home state (or state where you intend to work).

*MED 122 is not an approved transfer elective under the CAA; students are not expected to complete this course before transferring to ECU. However, should the course be completed, it will transfer toward the student's degree at ECU.
