East Carolina University, **BS REHABILITATION SERVICES**

Admission to the Rehabilitation Services, BS program requires

- a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA from ECU,
- completion of one core ADRE course within the rehabilitation services major with a C or better, and
- an application.

Program admission is competitive. Admission to the university and/or achieving a minimum 2.5 GPA does not guarantee admission to the degree program. Applications should be submitted when the student is nearing completion of 42 hours. Additional information and application for admission can be obtained from the Department of Addictions and Rehabilitation Studies.

Undergraduate students majoring in rehabilitation services are encouraged to minor in an established area consistent with individual academic and career goals or to take a composite minor of structured electives approved by the faculty advisor and department chair.

Transfer students should email an Academic Advisor as soon as possible, hpadvising@ecu.edu.

An example of how to plan your first 2 years of the traditional 4 years of study is included at the end of this document. However, depending on when you transfer and how many recommended courses you take at the community college, it may take longer than 4 years to complete any degree at ECU.

- Other courses to complete an AA or AS are student's choice; no other current department recommendations. Other equivalent courses may be listed in the degree requirements.

- You do not have to complete all NCCCS equivalents or recommended courses before transferring. However, taking minimal recommendations may prolong your time to degree at ECU.

*PSY 150 is not required for this degree; however, it is a pre-requisite for required courses PSY 237 and 281. It will transfer as General Education credit.

**MED 122 is not an approved transfer elective under the CAA; students are not expected to complete this course before transferring to ECU. However, if you do complete MED 122 it will transfer toward your degree at ECU.

***BIO 168 and BIO 169 transfer as BIOL 2XXX elective courses; however, they may be substituted for BIOL 2140, 2141, 2150, and 2151 by working with your advisor.
