East Carolina University, **BA SOCIOLOGY**

Students intending to major in Sociology must earn a "C" or higher in SOCI 2110 (SOC 210).

Transfer students should email an Academic Advisor as soon as possible, thcasadvising@ecu.edu.

An example of how to plan your first 2 years of the traditional 4 years of study is included at the end of this document. However, depending on when you transfer and how many recommended courses you take at the community college, it may take longer than 4 years to complete any degree at ECU.

- ECU's General Education Core can be used as possible suggestions for additional courses; however, completion of an approved NCCCS AA or AS waives the General Education requirement, with the exception of the Health Promotion and Health-Related Physical Activity requirement unless a student completes HEA 110.
