East Carolina University, **BSBA Supply Chain Management** 

The Supply Chain Management, BSBA develops business professionals who efficiently and effectively manage supply chain activities and resources to maximize customer value and achieve competitive advantage. The Supply Chain Management, BSBA focuses on sourcing of supply, management of materials and operations, and origin-to-destination logistics of products and services. Supply chain management also involves the study of global supply chain strategy and relationship management among members of a supply chain. Graduates pursue career choices in purchasing, inventory, materials management, operations, quality, project management, logistics, supply chain analytics, and global supply chain management.

Students must meet the following requirements prior to taking 4000-level major courses and most concentration courses:

- Completion of a minimum 45 s.h.
- Cumulative GPA of 2.5 on 4.0 scale.
- Completion of the declaration courses listed below or equivalent course work with a minimum grade of C- in each and 2.5 GPA over the eight courses: ACCT 2401, ACCT 2521, ECON 2113, ECON 2133, FINA 2244, MATH 1065, MATH 2228 or MATH 2283, and MIS 2223

Once enrolled at East Carolina University, a student will be limited to a maximum of two attempts per declaration course.
