NCCCS Associate in Arts *or* Associate in Science transfer to
East Carolina University, **BS COMMUNICATION**

The **Communication**, **BS** offers concentrations in

- interpersonal/organizational communication,
- journalism,
- media studies, or
- public relations.

Students must be admitted to the School of Communications to pursue one of these concentrations as their major.

Transfer students need a 2.5 GPA to declare a major in Communication.

Transfer of writing and core skill courses in public relations and journalism from outside institutions are viewed on a case-by-case basis by the School of Communication.

Time to degree completion will depend on student enrollment status and offering of required courses. It is highly recommended that transfer students contact commadvising@ecu.edu as soon as they enter their community college to discuss specific course suggestions.
