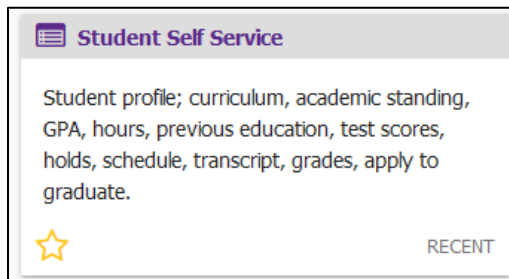



How do I unenroll from the Reverse Transfer Program

As a transfer student from a North Carolina Community College, the course credits you are earning toward your bachelor's degree may be applied toward the fulfillment of an associate's degree. Same work, double the diplomas - that's the Associate Degree Advantage!

By authorizing the release of your records now, the community college you attended will determine when you have completed the required coursework to earn the associate's degree. Click "Yes" below and you are done. **There is no cost** for sending your information and awarding of the degree. If you wish to receive a printed diploma or to participate in graduation ceremonies there may be a cost and the community college will inform you of what you need to do. The Community College will evaluate your credits from the university and inform you if you have earned an associate degree. Please note that ECU academic advisors cannot provide advising for community college coursework.

You must have completed/earned at least 16 college-level credit hours in residency at one North Carolina Community College that will apply toward your degree to be eligible for the program.
